## Pupil Premium - Extra Support for your child

As a school, we are always looking for any way we can support our pupils. Pupils who receive Free School Meals or who have a parent in the Armed Forces can be supported in school financially by the Local Authority Pupil Premium allocation. This is used in a range of ways including extra 1:1 lessons, increasing the Learning Support contact or financial help with trips and visits. Pupils are eligible for Pupil Premium if you are entitled to receive one or more of the following:

- Income Support
- Income Based Jobseekers Allowance (NOT contribution based JSA)
- An income-related employment and support allowance (NOT contribution based ESA)
- Support under part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guarantee element of State Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit, provided you are not entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual income (as assessed by HM Revenue and Customs) that does not exceed £16,190
- Working Tax Credit 'run-on' – the payment you receive for a further four weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit.
- Universal Credit
- A parent in the Armed Forces.

We appreciate this is a sensitive matter and thus treat any information shared as confidential. If you come under any of the categories above please contact the school for more information.



### Flu immunisation

We have been contacted by Virgincare to inform us that in view of the increased cases of Flu this year, NHS England have taken the decision to extend the vaccination programme and make more vaccine available. Therefore, there will be unexpected extended opportunities for your child to be vaccinated in community clinics; **this is for those who have not already been vaccinated and are in the eligible cohort Year R, 1, 2, 3 or 4.** This is regardless of whether you filled in a negative consent form in the first instance. If you would like to take up this opportunity, please contact the immunisation team on: 0333 2341125 to book into a community clinic. Please note that this will be offered on a first come/first served basis until vaccine has run out, therefore early contact is advised. We would like to also take this opportunity to encourage general hand hygiene with the 'catch it, bin it, kill it' message.

### Gum shields

Premier Sports are coaching KS2 in hockey. Whilst they have been learning on the playground they have been using plastic hockey sticks, however, after half term Premier Sports will be coaching field hockey using wooden sticks. The hockey guidelines state that all children should wear gum shields and, therefore, we have purchased gum shields at a cost of £1.00 each for the children to keep in school. If a child loses their gum shield we will need to ask for the replacement cost. Thank you.
